


MINERAL SYMPOSIUM

The New Mexico Mineral Symposium provides a forum for both professionals and amateurs interested in mineralogy. The meeting allows all to share their cumulative knowledge of mineral occurrences, and provides stimulus for mineralogical studies and new mineral discoveries. In addition, the informal atmosphere encourages intimate discussions among all interested in mineralogy and associated fields.

This year's symposium will consist of a day and a half of formal papers presented in 30-minute time blocks. Topics will include mineralogy, mining and collecting history, and mineral occurrences in New Mexico and beyond. An informal pre-symposium social and tailgating session will be held at local motels beginning on Friday, November 10, and will last throughout the weekend.

The general registration fee for the symposium is \$50, and the fee for students is \$25 (with student ID). Mineral Symposium registration includes a copy of the abstracts, two continental breakfasts, and coffee breaks. They will cover the whole process—setting up a photography system, taking the photographs, lighting tips, slabbing and stacking photos, all the way through to post-processing. FEATURED SPEAKER



DR. ELOÏSE GAILLOU is curator at the Mineralogy Museum of l'École des Mines de Paris (Paris School of Mines), now known as MINES ParisTech. After a master's degree in geology/petrology, she received her PhD in material sciences at the University of Nantes (France) studying opals. She combined her PhD with a DUG (Diplôme d'Université de Gemmologie), beginning her work on diamonds. Dr. Gaillou continued studying diamonds during her postdoc at the Smithsonian Institution, then at the Carnegie Institution, both in Washington, D.C. She took the position of associate curator at the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County in 2012 before eventually heading back to France in 2015 to take the position at the School of Mines, where she oversees the collection of 100,000 specimens and takes care of the permanent and temporary exhibits. Dr. Gaillou is the author of more than 40 articles, notably on opals and diamonds. She is currently president of the Society of Mineral Museum Professionals (SMMP) and, since the end of 2022, the new French National Representative for the International Mineralogical Association Commission on Museums. She is a member of the MSA (Mineralogical Society of America), MetSoc (Meteoritical Society), SGF (Geological Society of France), and SFMC (French Society of Mineralogy and Crystallography).
