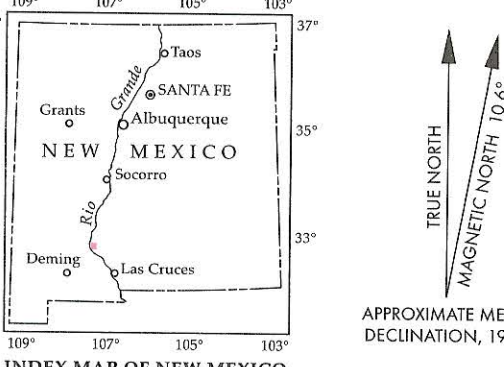




conglomerate contains a large proportion of porphyritic intermediate-composition lava or hypabyssal intrusive clasts and lesser amounts of Paleozoic and Precambrian clasts. Several such beds totalling 100 m (328 ft) or more are present in the McLeod Tank quadrangle. The rest of the formation consists of finer-grained, purple, gray, green, and red mudstone, sandstone, and latharic breccia, although fresh-water algal limestone beds (TppL), as much as 35 m (115 ft) thick, are discontinuously present at the top of the formation. The formation is essentially andesitic in composition. As much as 457 m (1,500 ft) thick.



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
