# Introduction to ATI

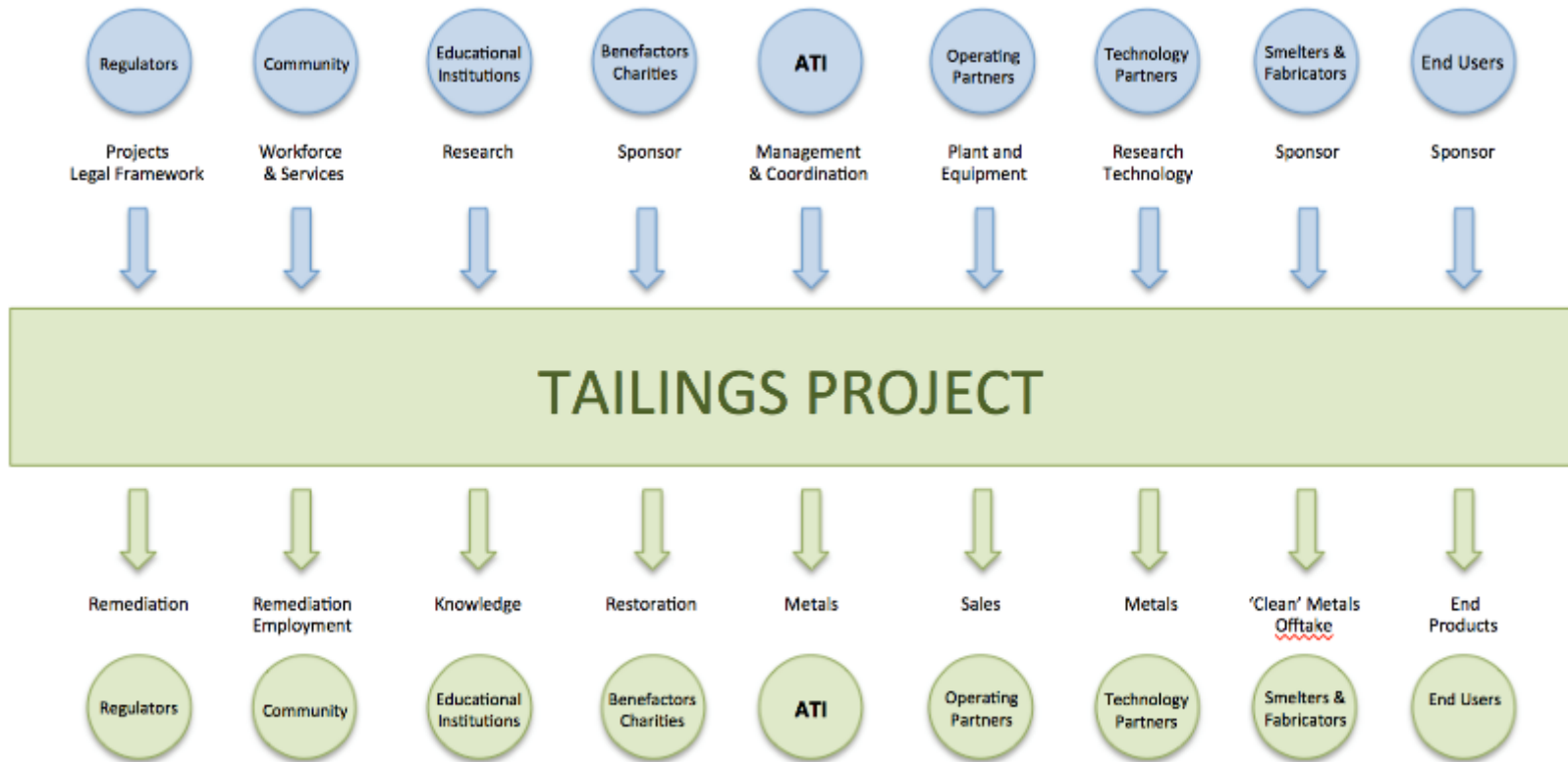
Americas Tailings Inc. (ATI) is a Denver-based *Earth-Friendly* resource company focused on securing rights to develop historical tailings sites in the western USA and, by applying modern, commercially-viable, environmentally-friendly processing technologies, to extract the metals value and remediate the tailings sites

# Strategic Approach

- New metals production in USA from historical tailings sites
- Remediation of sites using modern processing technologies
- Revitalization of areas by enabling new use of land
- Generation of local employment and commerce through new operations
- Potential to convert remediated tailings for alternative industrial uses
- Commitment to responsible, innovative development of mining industry
- Commitment to needs and concerns of all Stakeholders

# Utah Land Trust Project

- Collaboration among ATI, the State of Utah School and Institutional Trust Lands Administration (“SITLA”), the University of Utah
- Project to investigate the potential for future reprocessing, remediation and revitalization of one or more historical tailings sites, principally on properties under SITLA management (total: 3.4 million acres)
- Inventory work and sampling conducted in cooperation with faculty and students from the University of Utah’s College of Mines and Earth Sciences, which is partially supported with proceeds from designated SITLA lands
- ATI provides guidance and use of evaluation software to assist compilation of information into a database that can perform inventory, evaluation and prioritization of historical tailings sites

# U.S. Tailings Remediation

- ATI has established a Colorado non-profit corporation, U.S. Tailings Remediation (USTR), to promote and manage efforts to remediate and revitalize historical mining and tailings sites
- Provides a legal structure to perform remediation efforts, and to isolate historical legacy issues
- Collaborative approach with federal, state and local institutions, education institutions, non-profit organizations, foundations and others having interest in abandoned mine and historical tailings sites
- Utah Land Trust Project has identified 2 opportunities with potential for remediation and revitalization, and ATI has initiated discussions with local city counsels on plan and legal framework to advance
