

- ➤ 11 active adjudications in Federal or State Court -> 9 involve claims/settlements with Pueblos/Tribes/Nations ("PTN"):
  - 1. Animas River Stream System
  - 2. Chama River Stream System (Aragon)
  - 3. Jemez River Stream System (Abousleman)
  - 4. Lower Rio Grande Stream System
  - 5. Pecos River Stream System (Lewis)
  - 6. Rio Pueblo de Taos/Rio Hondo Stream System (Abeyta)
  - 7. Rio San Jose Stream System (*Kerr-McGee*)
  - 8. San Juan River Stream System
  - 9. Santa Cruz/Truchas Rivers Stream System (Abbott)
  - 10. Santa Fe River Stream System (Anaya)
  - 11. Zuni River Stream System (A&R)
- ➤ 1 recently completed adjudication involved 4 Pueblos:
  - Nambé, Pojoaque, Tesuque Stream System/Basin (Aamodt)
- Some PTN have potential claims in stream systems that do not have an adjudication filed
- Some PTN have claims in more than one adjudication or stream system



- > 7 PTN have reached final settlement agreements, Congressional Act passed, funding approved by Congress and State Legislature:
  - ➤ Jicarilla Apache Tribe (San Juan River Stream System/Basin)
  - ➤ Jicarilla Apache Tribe (Chama River Stream System/Basin)
  - > Taos Pueblo (Rio Pueblo de Taos/Rio Hondo Stream System) (seeking additional funding)
  - ➤ Navajo Nation (San Juan Stream System) (seeking additional funding for Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project)
  - ➤ Nambé Pueblo (Nambé, Pojoaque, Tesuque Stream System/Basin)
  - > Pojoaque Pueblo (Nambé, Pojoaque, Tesuque Stream System/Basin)
  - > Tesuque Pueblo (Nambé, Pojoaque, Tesuque Stream System/Basin)
  - San Ildefonso Pueblo (Nambé, Pojoaque, Tesuque Stream System/Basin)
- ➤ 1 PTN litigated its water rights
  - Mescalero Apache (Rio Hondo –
     Pecos River Stream System/Basin)



- > 9\* PTN are in active negotiations with a federal negotiation team:
  - ➤ 4 PTN have signed local settlement agreements and have federal legislation introduced in Congress (S.595, H.R. 1304 *introduced 3/1/2023*)

    - ➤ Ohkay Owingeh\* (Santa Cruz/Truchas Stream System)
    - ➤ Ute Mountain Ute Tribe (San Juan River)



- ➤ 6 PTN have federal assessment teams appointed:

  - ➤ Isleta Pueblo (Middle Rio Grande Stream System)
  - > San Felipe Pueblo (Middle Rio Grande Stream System)
  - ➤ Sandia Pueblo (Middle Rio Grande Stream System)
  - > Santa Ana Pueblo (Middle Rio Grande Stream System)
  - ➤ Santo Domingo/Kewa Pueblo (Middle Rio Grande Stream System)
- ➤ 1 PTN is in litigation:

# Basic Steps to Reaching Water Rights Settlement Agreement (More or Less)



- A. Federal Assessment Team
- B. Federal Negotiation Team
- C. Negotiations with Pueblo/Tribe/Nation, United States and State
- D. Negotiations expanded to include local entities, acequias, irrigation districts, municipalities, cities, etc.
- E. Local Settlement Agreement signed by all Parties but for United States
- F. Parties draft Federal Legislation
- G. Review by Working Group and SIWRO
- H. Federal Legislation introduced in House and Senate;
   Congressional Hearings
- I. Once passed by Congress parties conform the Settlement
   Agreement
- J. Approval and signing of conformed Settlement Agreement by Department of the Interior
- K. Regular court adjudication process for entry of a Partial Final Judgment and Decree adjudicating the water rights within a stream system/basin and accepting the Settlement Agreement (includes *inter se*)
- L. State funding process Indian Water Rights Settlement Fund 9

# Key Components of a Pueblo, Tribe, Nation Water Rights Settlement Agreement

Each Settlement Agreement is unique, BUT there are some common components for a thorough settlement and adjudication of water rights, such as:

- 1. Parties to the Settlement Agreement
- 2. Definitions
- 3. Water Rights of Pueblo/Tribe/Nation
- 4. Traditional Uses/Cultural Protection
- 5. Projects or Special Uses
- 6. Basin Management for all Users in the Stream System/Basin
- 7. Administration within Pueblo/Tribe/Nation
- 8. Leasing of Water Rights
- 9. Federal Settlement Funding
- 10. State Funding
- 11. General Provisions
- 12. Waivers/Releases of Claims
- 13. Conditions Precedent
- 14. Exhibits/Appendix/Hydrographic Survey

Laws of 2023 (HB 1, § 108): \$20,000,000 to State Engineer "to support and fund Indian water rights settlements, for expenditure in fiscal years 2025 through 2027."

## New Mexico's Goals in Water Rights Settlements

- 1. Defining the elements of water rights of the Pueblo, Tribe, or Nation
- 2. Reducing or eliminating uncertainty regarding the administration of water rights
- Avoiding or mitigating adverse impacts on non-Pueblo users from increased Pueblo/Tribe/Nation uses of water
- 4. Avoiding Interstate Compact challenges associated with increased use of water
- 5. Securing federal and state funds for New Mexico infrastructure projects
- 6. Protecting sacred places, recognizing cultural practices, incorporating restoration
- 7. Ensuring implementation is feasible and understood by all

OVERALL GOAL: Securing a reliable water future for all water users in the face of a diminishing supply, and ensuring that any necessary reductions in use are just, equitable, and predictable.
