



Forward Progress: Water Wins in 2025 Legislative Session (BUDGET - \$380M)

Conservation & Infrastructure (\$261.8M)

- \$200M to water project fund
- \$25M for Indian water rights settlements
- \$15M to Rural Infrastructure Program Fund
- \$6M for water planning and education
- \$5M for ag water conservation projects

All numbers on this slide are new nonrecurring appropriations.

New Sources (\$57.5M)

- \$40M for strategic water supply
- \$8M for brackish water technology, research and NMSU lab
- \$7.5M for aquifer monitoring and mapping
- \$2M for water data act

Protection (\$60.7M)

- \$20M to cleanup contaminated sites
- \$20M for forest management and restoration
- \$12M for wildfire mitigation
- \$5.7M for Superfund sites
- \$3M to address PFAS contamination

- ✓ Strategic Water Supply Act advancing brackish water projects to offset demand for freshwater
- ✓ Water Quality Act changes protecting all surface waters of New Mexico from pollution and advancing groundwater cleanup
- ✓ PFAS laws keeping PFAS out of products and the environment
- ✓ Strategic Water Reserve Fund better mechanism to managing funds for the Reserve
- ✓ Stormwater utilities giving local govts a way to generate revenue for stormwater management practices
- ✓ Supporting MRGCD elections
- ✓ Updating Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund to include all federal flexibilities
- ✓ Capital Outlay for many local and statewide projects, including \$9M to OSE and \$5M for NMED's river stewardship program
